The US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) announced in 2018 that the State of Florida would receive \$633,485,000 in funding to support long-term mitigation efforts following Hurricanes Hermine, Irma through HUD's Community Matthew. and Development Block Grant-Mitigation (CDBG-MIT) Program. This funding is intended to ensure the State of Florida is more resilient to future natural disasters. The Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) allocated CDBG-MIT funds to the State, which launched the Rebuild Florida General Infrastructure Program to provide funding to units of local government, state agencies, non-profits, and non-governmental organizations to implement mitigation activities that reduce hazard risks such as flooding, severe storms, tropical cyclones, coastal erosion, and wildfires.

The City of Sarasota in conjunction with The Bay Park Conservancy is developing an application for the Florida **Department of Economic Opportunity Community** Development Block Grant (CDBG-MIT) Rebuild Florida General Infrastructure Program. The City is applying for approximately \$2.5 Million in funding to mitigate the risks to the surrounding community by raising Van Wezel Way Road which is subject to flooding, creating a living shoreline, and floodable green space, which will allow flood waters to rise, be absorbed, and naturally recede to mitigate the effects of coastal storms and flooding from severe rainfall and king tide events. The grant compliments application the City's Sustainability Program and Climate Adaptation Plan. This project is part of a larger effort to revitalize the existing 54-acre park to increase the environmental resilience, public engagement and education, connectivity via multi-modal trails and boardwalks, and preserve the cultural and historic legacies of the area. The funding will mitigate risks to the protected Community Lifelines of 1) Safety & Security and 2) Transportation. The applications must be submitted to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity by September 14, 2020.
